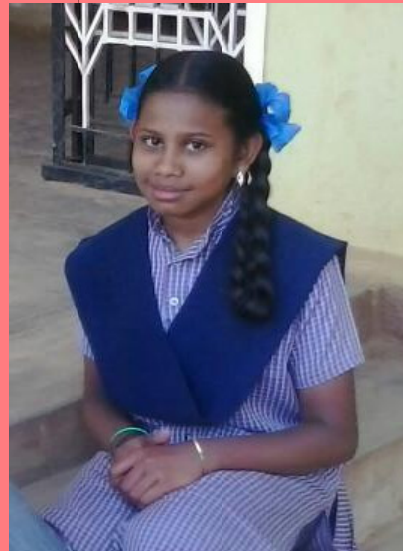
Dear Friends,

We at Ullas are happy to bring to you an edition covering the happenings from our various chapters! We are proud to share with you that as of Jan 2014, we have reached a total of 6,728 children across our chapters under the Summit program including new Achievers joining our fold (1,983 Class 9 children). And under our Touch The Soil initiative, we are thrilled to share that we have covered across the 4 states of TamilNadu, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and NCR region, 58 districts, 179 schools, 1213 scholarships (Class 9-10), and conducted Diary of Dreams workshop and Planning workshop for 70,000 students (Class 9-12). We still have two more months to reach our goal of 100,000 students in TTS this year and we are looking good to achieve the same.

We thank you for your unfailing support towards both the Summit and TTS initiative and for keeping Ullas flying high amongst the children and the schools! In this newsletter we have endeavored to bring you snippets from key happenings across our chapters, and insight into our Ullas students, and Volunteers – a regular feature we hope to cover from here on. Meet Malar



Malar is a Class X student of St. Charles HSS in Aathanavoor Village, Vellore District. She was awarded the Ullas scholarship during our TTS initiative district program held in Vellore. 15 year old Malar is a bright student, whose father is a coolie with daily wage of Rs.100. Despite the hardships her father has managed to put Malar, her elder sister (currently in Class 12), and her older brother (pursuing a polytechnic course) through school ensuring that they don't miss out on their education.

Malar aims to be a doctor and has already begun her preparation by identifying medicines used for various illnesses. The scholarship she received during her Class 9 has motivated her to pursue her students with greater vigor and she in turn is motivating her juniors in school as well. She considers Ullas scholarship and workshops as important instruments of transformation in her life and other rural children like her, residing in Yelagiri hills.

TTS with a difference! At Nagapattinam District

Ullas one-day workshop for the teachers
happening simultaneously at the eight
talukas in Nagapattinam District

(Vedaranyam, Keezhvelur, Kuthalam,
Nagapattinam, Tharangambadi, Tirukuvalai,
Mayiladuthurai, Sirkazhi)



Ullas embarked on its very first TTS “with a difference” – a pilot Touch The Soil program that reached out to 480+ teachers in 8 talukas in Nagapattinam district. At the behest of the District Collector (Mr.Munusamy), and the District Chief Educational Officer (CEO-Mr.Ramakrishnan) and in support of their program to “increase pass percentage of 10th and 12th standard students” – Ullas conducted on Saturday, 25th January, a one day workshop for the teachers.

Given that the board exams are around the corner (beginning March 1st), the CEO requested Ullas to conduct a workshop for the teachers who in turn can take the message, tips / aids to their children as part of their revision schedule. With that thought, the Ullas team put together a one day workshop consisting of the Diary of Dreams workshop and the following lesson plans – Planning and Prioritization, Memory Techniques, and Stress Management – very relevant for the students taking their Boards.



Ultimate goal being – inspire, and encourage the teachers to be change agents! This pilot TTS program with a difference was conducted simultaneously across all 8 talukas of Nagapattinam on the same day. Each taluka had a maximum of 60 teachers and the Ullas team comprised of 2 trainers from Polaris, 1 Higher Education Scholarship student, 2-3 Vidyarambam Trust tutors. The overall program was received extremely well by the participating teachers. Specifically stress management – how to identify, cope and address stress was well received by the teachers! This was one where the teachers did role-plays both as children and as adults to better understand coping techniques.

It was heartening to see the teachers turn into children for the day, especially during the role plays, warm up games and exercises. They even took center stage to share about their dreams! Interestingly the experience of the teachers ranged from 2 years to 20+ years. At each location, the trainers shared with the teachers the need to go beyond their curriculum and the absolute need to spend time with their students to better understand their fears, their dreams, and their aspirations and be their guiding star!

The workshop ended on a high note with the teachers expressing their happiness and thanks to the Ullas team for having inspired, motivated, and rejuvenated them to reach out to their children! Each of them made a commitment that they will incorporate elements of the workshop into their classrooms from thereon.

A hearty thank you to all the volunteers of Polaris who made this possible! And kudos to the entire Ullas team for having pulled off a one-day workshop across 8 locations on the same day at such short notice (10days). It was a moment of elation for all involved in this workshop when we realized that these 482 teachers in turn will reach that many more children in the coming days – igniting their dreams and inspiring them to achieve!

Velraj, along with his enthusiastic band of team comprising of Satha G, Uma Maheswaran D, Kannan Rajaram, Suresh K V, went from district to district as part of Touch The Soil program. They covered 20 schools in Ariyalur and Tiruvarur districts.

In his words “The journey of shaping young minds in the rural villages of our southern districts was really amazing to us as a team. She came upto the podium and announced her intention to serve her school in future, similar to the manner in which Ullas has been rendering support to the rural children. Parents in the group also endorsed her comments and thanked the Ullas team for the support given to rural schools”.
